

Transcript for video voice over to Marianne Solberg, Jeanette Koht.  
Dystonia induced by drug treatment. Tidsskr Nor Legeforen 2016; 136: 1730.

The patient attended the accident and emergency department due to involuntary movements of the tongue and jaw.

She says that her tongue is being stretched forward out of her mouth, that her jaw feels stiff, and that her lower jaw is being pushed towards the right.

She finds it difficult to keep her mouth closed and her jaw feels tight. The patient is asked to keep her mouth closed, open her mouth, and stretch out and move her tongue.

When at rest, the tongue is pushed outwards and the lower jaw is pushed towards the right. She finally reveals that she has taken Afipran, and that she never wants to take it again.
